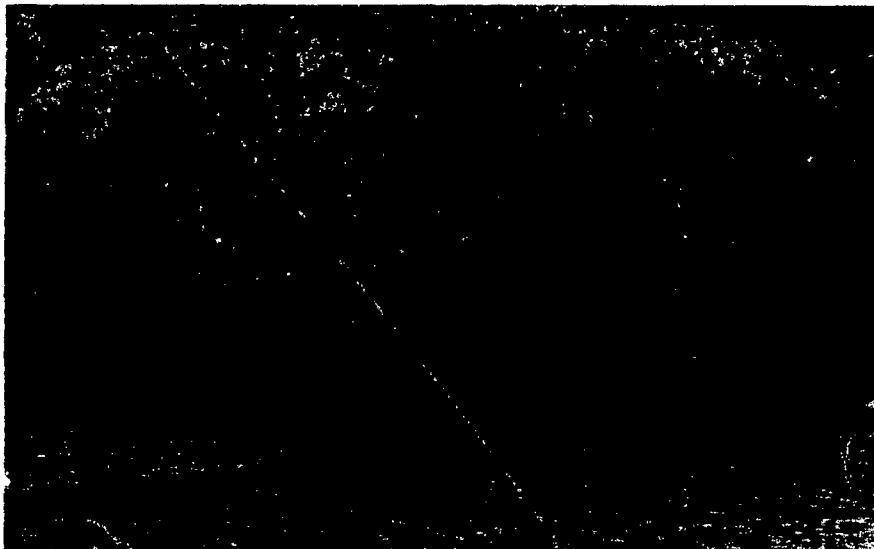

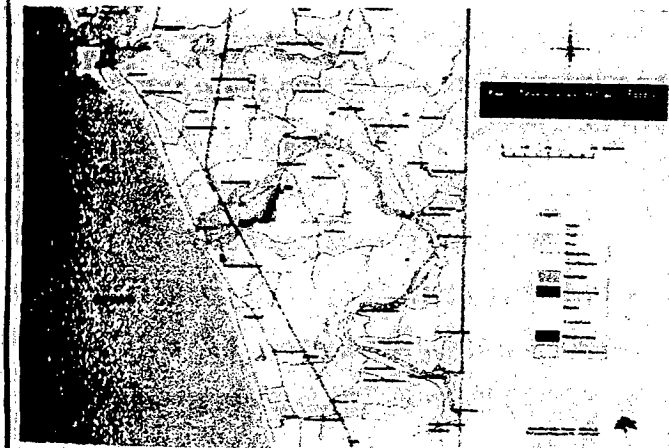
Introduction

Kadalundi-Vallikkunnu region is an estuarine ecosystem with unique ecological significance because of its rich and diverse nature resources especially mangrove vegetation, birds, fisheries, etc. The area is well known destination and habitat for migratory and wetland birds. The mangroves, the mudflats, and the rich food available for the avian fauna had turned this location into one of the prominent ecosystem for birds of the world. The community of Kadalundi was never inhospitable to the winged guests. However due to population pressure, growing tourism industry and the unplanned development activities, it is likely that there can be threat for the ecosystem and its resources of especially Mangroves, Birds, Fisheries and Agricultural recourse of the Kadalundy region. To prevent such growing threats and to provide space for co-existence of the community, resources and the estuarine system, the area has been declared as the Kadalundi-Vallikkunnu Community Reserve.

Geographical location

The name of the community reserve is declared as Kadalundi-Vallikkunnu Community Reserve and notified as per G.O. No. (MS)No.66/2007 F &WLD dated 17.10.2007 under Wildlife Protection

Act 1972 of 36c and area extents about 150 Ha. in Kadalundi of Kozhikode Taluk, Kozhikode District and in Vallikkunnu, Thirurangadi Taluk, Malappuram District. The boundaries of the Reserve area in Vallikkunnu is Kadalundi, Vallikkunnu Panchayath boundary Northern side, Mangrove area of the left bank of the Kadalundi river at Southern side, Kottakadavu bridge at Eastern side and arabian sea as western boundary. In Kadalundi northern side is the



mangrove area and the right bank of Kadalundi river at the Southern side.

Nature Resource Status

The lands converted for coconut and other agriculture crops must be mangrove wetlands decades ago. However, larger canals across the coconut farms connect the water spread area of the river on either side creating vascular network of estuarine biodiversity and its habitate. This is an added advantage for the prolific growth of fish fauna in the region. The river mouth, the mudflat, the

mangroves, the interlinking canals, the coconut farms and the wide spread wetland ecosystem create the unique habitat both for the human beings and other living organisms of the region. This unique pattern remains well integrated in a natural web of food chains, right from the detritus feeders and primary consumers (herbivores) to secondary or tertiary consumers(carnivores). The mangroves being located somewhat an isolated setting, comparatively distanced from human settlements, are amply used as the homing environs by a wide variety of animals, both invertebrates and vertebrates.

The fauna include fishes, mollusks of various types, fiddler crab, filter feeders like mussels, marine gastropods and even aquatic mammals . Many of the commercially harvested fish species act as the biggest attraction to the economy of the estuary. The tidal fresh water areas, ideally the mangrove fringing sites, are major nursery grounds for the juveniles fish species. The juveniles are often found in peak abundance in these waters foraging on invertebrates during the growing phase and they in turn become forage fish for many larger fish predators and birds

The mangroves and the associated wetlands provide good foraging ground for many species of migratory shore birds, gulls, terns, and other resident water fowls. The area is rich with a bird diversity of as many as 106 species of which 36 species are migrants. The Kadalundi mangrove wetlands are probably one among the best known coastal sites for abundance of avifauna in Kerala. The mangrove patches provide suitable habitat for mammals like otters, jackals and common mongooses. The diversity in resource utilization is yet another phenomenon of Kadalundi area. This ranges from agriculture, sand mining to shell mining, fishing, oyster catching, mussel farming, peat collection, coir retting etc. Nowadays the boundless possibilities of eco tourism are also being explored by the local inhabitants.

Conservation value of the resources in the area

The unique natural resource days of the area is ideal for conservation, resource enhancement and biodiversity based enterprise development owing to the following characteristic

1. A significant bird migration centre and an abode for shore birds, gulls, terns etc.
2. An integrated ecosystem ideal for the proliferation of fish, arthropods, mollusks and other aquatic organisms.
3. Agricultural product diversification and value addition.
4. An area for recreational and eco educational values.

Objectives of the programme

The major objectives of the programme are

1. Awareness creation on nature resource conservation.
2. Promoting ecosystem enrichment program through stakeholder participation.
3. Livelihood enhancement through empowerment of stakeholder and sustainable utilization of the nature resources.
4. Empowerment of Panchayath Raj Institutions and conservation agencies.

5. Production of empowerment material for nature resource conservation and sustainable utilization for livelihood development.

5. Preparation of empowerment booklets and popularization of tools and skills for participatory natural resource conservation and livelihood development.

Physical achievement of the project

Associated with the Kadalundi Vallikkunnu Community Management Committee in conducting a Participatory Rural Appraisal at 5 locations of the Community Reserve. PRA is a method for deriving real aspirations of the community regarding any issue through enthusing the local people to provide exact information using specific tools. The Community Reserve area has been divided into 5 regions and prepared the microplan.

- Plakkad (75 Stakeholders)
- Kunnamthiruthi (50)
- Keezhayil (75)
- Heerus Nagar (500)
- Balathuruthi (50), (only Informations Gathered)

According to the resource availability and socioeconomic condition of the region, a microplan prepared for each region by the Community Reserve Management Committee. This microplan has been used in the study. A socioeconomic survey also conducted in association with the Community Reserve Management Committee revealed the economic and social profile of the Stakeholder Community. Based on that, two major resource sectors were identified for the empowerment of the stakeholders according to the resources availability and socio economic conditions of the community in the area. Since Vallikkunnu Panchayath is having vast area of coconut plantations and also having many coir based cottage industries, a coir based empowerment programme has organized. The empowerment programme for the coir sector development using appropriate technologies was organized in collaboration with the Central Coir Research Institute, Alappuzha. The major nature resource base of the Kadalundi region was identified through PRA process and socioeconomic survey

is in the fisheries sector. Second empowerment programme for the development of this sector was organised in association with Centre for Marine Fisheries, Research Institute (CMFRI), Regional Centre, Kozhikode, Central Institute of Fisheries Technology (CIFT), Cochi, Mastyafed, Kozhikode, Centre for Science Technology and Entrepreneurship Development (C STED), Kozhikode, Fish Farmers Development Agencies, FFDA, Ernakulam, Krishi Vigyana Kendra (KVK), Kozhikode and Dept of Fisheries, Govt. of Kerala.

Stakeholder Empowerment Programme

Coir sector Empowerment programme

Vallikkunnu Panchayath of Malappuram District is blessed with thick coconut plantation and plenty of coconut husk is available for different end uses. Several enterprises especially small scale industrial units based on coir are working with unskilled labourers and supported by old machineries. Most of these units, are in the sick category and needs immediate intervention with sophisticated technologies and strategic marketing techniques. Since the existing enterprises are not profitable, new ventures are not coming in the coir sector and the resources are kept unused. Considering the above facts, it was decided to organise an empowerment workshop in coir sector at Vallikkunnu Panchayath. One day long empowerment workshop was organized in collaboration with the Central Coir Research Institute, Alappuzha, which is a Research Institute under Central Coir Board, Govt. of India. An Exhibition on value added coir products, various machineries developed by the Central Coir Research Institute and various coir products of Kadalundi Coir Swayam Sahayaka Sangham Society were also arranged to familiarize the participant with the modern trends for the development of coir sector. Scientists from Central Coir Research Institute, Officers of the District Industries Centre and State Coir Board were associated as experts of the workshop. Sixty seven stakeholder representatives related to coir sector and residing in different Panchayath wards viz. 2, 3,4, 5,10 and 23 of Vallikkunnu Panchayath coming in the area Kadalundi Vallikkunnu Community Reserve were participated in the Empowerment programme. The programme was inaugurated by Dr.U.S.Sharma, Director, Central Coir Research Institute, Alappuzha in a function presided by Smt.K.M.P Khairunnisa, Chairperson, Standing Committee, Vallikkunnu Panchayath. Members of the Panchayath Shri. E. K. Mohammed, Shri.Baburaj, Shri.K.P.Hannefa, Smt.A.P.Sindu, Smt.Thankamani,

Smt.K.Thulasi and Dr.Anitha Das, Scientist, Central Coir Research Institute were felicitated. Shri. M. Karikutty, Vice President, Vallikkunnu Panchayath has inaugurated the Coir Product Exhibition. Dr. K.

V Mohammed Kunhi, Co ordinator of the Science Popularization Project welcomed the gathering and Shri Prabhakaran, Range forester, Kerala Forest Department, Govt. of Kerala proposed the formal vote of thanks.

In the technical session of the workshop Dr. Sharma demonstrated various technologies developed by the Central Coir Research Institute in the area of mechanization, technology up gradation, product diversification and value addition. He has briefed about the interventions, mechanization process especially upgradation of the existing machineries for spinning, fiber extraction, geotextiles application, and development of value added and innovative products. He also urged the panchayath authorities and N(C)s to associate with the modernization and upgradation of the coir sector and popularise the

innovation initiatives of the Coir board.

The second session of the workshop was handled by Dr. Anitha Das, Central Coir Research Institute. She has explained various technologies developed using coir pith. According to Dr. Anitha, the coir fibre constitute only one third of the coconut husk and the remaining two third is the coir pith. This byproduct of the coir industry can be converted in to organic manure using



microbial degradation, making ideal for gardening and horticulture. A wide variety of coir pith products like coir pith bag, discs, C-POM etc ideal for gardening and horticulture needs can be developed as a successful enterprise for the women groups. She has demonstrated various technologies developed for composting coir pith and converting in to a rich natural organic manure. She has also explained a ready made lawn branded as "Cocolawn" which consist of coir pith and grass. The ready to use Coco lawn is made available in the form of a blanket, which can be shifted from one place to another and can be rolled up for transportation. The principle involved in this technology is to adopt an eco friendly method for faster development of readymade lawns using nature coir products. This can also develop in to a meaningful enterprise for different stakeholder groups including women.

In the third session Sri. M.K. Balraj, Ast. District Industries officer elaborated the need of skill upgradation of coir workers, quality improvement of coir products and encouragement, promotion and entrepreneur development programmes among the stakeholders. There was a panel discussion and an interactive session with the Panchayath members, Kadalundi Vallikkunnu Community Reserve authorities, Officials of the Department of Industries and Coir experts from Coir Board which highlighted the urgency to strengthen the strategies for the overall development of the coir sector in the area. It also emphasized the necessity of exploring the maximum possibility of both the export and domestic market of finished coir products. The potential of the domestic market of this sector is not yet explored properly.

Scientific and focused strategies need to be worked out to tap the domestic market. Possibilities of opening outlets in association with co operative institutions, linkages with the traders and trading houses and Kudumbashree units were explored. In the concluding session Sri. U. Kalanadhan, Former Vallikkunnu Panchayath President and Member of the Kadalundi

Vallikkunnu Community Reserve Management Committee was the Chief Guest and distributed the certificates to the participants.

Fisheries Sector Empowerment Programme

Kadalundi Panchayath is blessed with vast areas of water resources having fresh water and estuarine characteristics. Most of the people are directly or indirectly linked with the fisheries sector. Famous Beypore fish landing centre and estuary is situated adjacent to this Panchayath. Kadalundi (Trama Panchayath also have plan allocation and already initiated few projects for the development of fisheries resources in the area. Considering the immense scope for the development of fisheries resources and aiming to enhance the livelihood status of the fishermen community, an empowerment workshop has organized at Kadalundi Panchayath. The programme envisaged to empower the fisheries based stakeholders with modern technologies available with different agencies and to promote them to start fisheries related enterprises development.

The fisheries empowerment workshop was organized at fisheries school, Vattapparamb of Kadalundi on 27th December 2012 and Seventy one stakeholders in fisheries sector from different regions of Kadalundi Panchayath Coming under Kadalundi Panchayath Community Reserve area (Ward 1,2,7,12,14,17, 20, 21 and 22) were participated in the empowerment programme. (Appendix - 2) National agencies like Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute, Regional Station, Govt. of India, Kozhikode, Central Institute of Fisheries Technology, Govt. of India, Kochi, Krishi Vigyana Kendra, Govt of India, Kozhikkode, State agencies like Dept. of Fisheries, Matsyafed, Fish Farmers Development Agency, Ernakulam. Fishermen Welfare Fund Board, local agencies like Fisheries Club, Kadalundi- Vallikkunnu Community Reserve Management Committee etc were associated with the programme. An exhibition on value added fish products including food items were exhibited as a separate stall for the participants of the workshop. Central Institute of Fisheries Technology, Matsyafed, Rifa Catering Centre, Kozhikode, Hamd Swayam Sahayaka Sngam, Beypore were exhibited their value added products.

The empowerment workshop has inaugurated by the Kadalundi Panchayath President Smt. T. K. Shylaja at Vattaparambu Govt. School, Kadalundi. In the inaugural session, Shri. Anil Marath,

In the technical Session, Dr. K.V. Mohammed Kunhi, Scientist, Malabar Botanical Garden, has given the key note address on "Fiseries resource conservation and enterprise development for better livelihood" and highlighted the scope for

the entrepreneur development in the fisheries sector. In the first technical session Dr. B. Pradeep, Scientist from Krishi Vigyana Kendra, Kozhikode has given an overview of the various fisheries development programmes and elaborated various culture technologies fish farmers can adopt and develop enterprises including ornamental fisheries. In the second presentation of the technical session, Shri. P.H. Anwar Ali, Aquaculture Expert, Fish Farmers Development Agency, Fisheries department, Thiruvananthapuram has given a detailed presentation on Ornamental fish culture and possibilities for entrepreneurship development. He has demonstrated various breeding techniques and cultivation procedures of different native species ideal for large scale multiplication for enterprise development. In the afternoon session of the technical session, Dr. A.A Zynudheen, Scientist, Central Institute of Fisheries Technology, Kochi has reviewed various fish processing technique available for fisheries

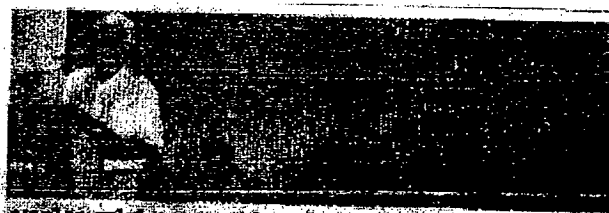

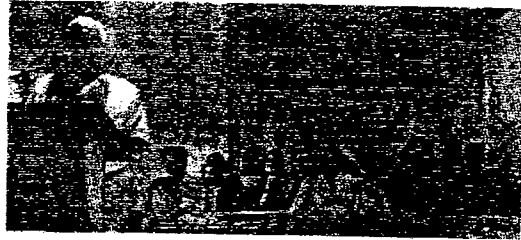
